Project Update

Medicine Hat Regional Hospital Redevelopment



Overview

- The project will feature a major redevelopment and expansion of the existing hospital and Energy Centre.
- An ambulatory care hub will be created within the new expanded facility.
- The emergency department will be redeveloped.
- All surgical services will be incorporated into new contemporary suites that accommodate procedures for inpatients and outpatients.
- The maternal child program will be consolidated within a distinct area that encompasses inpatient and outpatient services.
- Building systems upgrades and site development including parking and drop off areas will be undertaken.
- A new heliport is planned for the roof of the expansion.

Hospital services:

- Expanded emergency department
- Diagnostic imaging (roughed- in space for future development)
- Complete mechanical and emergency electrical backup upgrades (generators and chillers)
- New and upgraded surgical units (six)
- Physiotherapy and occupational therapy

The new six story expansion will include:

- Cardio-respiratory services
- Ambulatory (outpatient) care
- Maternal newborn services
- Renal program

- Surgical services
- Cancer clinic
- Sterile processing department
- New heliport

Construction Update: Medicine Hat Regional Hospital

• The Medicine Hat Regional Hospital is a \$220 million project that is expected to be completed in 2016.

What has been recently completed?

- The Energy Centre building envelope has been completed.
- The chillers, emergency generators and the electrical switch gear at the Energy Centre are installed and are in the process of being commissioned.
- The concrete superstructure for the expansion is complete.
- An additional surface parking lot is complete.

What are we working on?

- Work has begun on the building envelope and mechanical rough-ins.
- Structural steel work is underway and is expected to be completed this fall.
- A portion of the landscaping work has commenced.

What will be happening?

- The internal renovations and construction activity will not begin until the new expansion has been completed.
- Later this year tenders will be issued for the interior finishes and final landscaping scope of work.

Interesting Facts

- The new Cancer Treatment Center area will be capable of handling 13,015 patient visits per year.
- The increase in the number Surgical Suites will provide capacity to handle expected 12,285 procedures annually, in 2011, 7,867 procedures were handled.
